## Literacy

- Fact files—children will create their own merged animal and use expanded noun phrases and adjectives separated by commas to create a fact file.
- Read books from Rachel Bright and Julia Donaldson.
- Diamante poems—plastic, Laudato Si, plastic pollution and caring for our world.
- Learning and identifying verbs, adjectives and nouns.
- Creating own emotive poetry

## Science

- Animals including humans
- Lifecycles of a human and some animals
- Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

## PE

- Children will continue to learn and use their multi-skills to dribble, bounce, pass and kick the ball
- Children will create an under the water dance

## PSHE

- Follow the weekly “Statements to Live By”
- Keeping safe/ Medicines and drugs.

## Geography/History

- The Great Fire of Newcastle and Gateshead
- Compare and contrast to The Great Fire of London
- Local historical study

## Computing

- Children will be introduced to Scratch Jnr– an animation programme
- Children will create an underwater animation

## At Home

- Look for shapes at home and in nature, how many faces/ edges and sides do they have?
- Learn about how you can recycle at home and make it a family activity
- Begin reading short chapter books together, talk about the story– write character descriptions based on your favourites

## Numeracy

- Time– telling the time on analogue and digital clocks as o'clock and half past.
- Shapes– learn the names and properties of all 2D and 3D shapes.
- Solve written word problems using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
