Literacy

Persuasive Writing: Children will read and respond to a variety of persuasive texts. They will learn about the language features of persuasive texts and will compose their own persuasive arguments based on the story "The Great Kapok Tree". They will use facts they have learnt within science lessons to give their arguments factual basis.

Stories with a historical setting: Children will study the novel 'Little House on the Prairie'. This will provide children with an insight into historical America. They will use the features of this text to write their own story set in American history.

Science

Living Things and Habitats:

Children will be taught to recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways. They will explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment. Children will recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

<u>PE</u>

Athletics: Children will learn about and participate in a number of athletic games. They will learn how to self analyse their performance and improve on their personal best.

Rounders: Children will learn the rules and skills for rounders. They will develop a clear understanding of the batting and fielding role and develop their skills for each.

Geography/History

Resources and trade: Children will learn about global trade and how the UK fits into this. They will learn about how access to food and water is unevenly spread around the world and will give reasons as to why this is. Children will also learn about different minerals.

Computing

<u>Computational Thinking:</u> Children will learn how algorithms work and will be able to detect and correct algorithms in programs.

French

Eurovision Song Contest: Children will match instrument words to the appropriate instrument. They will be able to say which instrument they play and which music they like using full sentences.

Numeracy
