


Music Development Plan: Overview of Provision

<p>Vision Statement</p>	<p>At St Aidan's we encourage a love of music within everything we do. We do this through performing, composing and appraising music. We use our Charanga scheme to listen and perform many different kinds of music. Our long term vision for music is that all children access high-quality music lessons that include both singing and instruments. We aim for children to have opportunities to join extra curricular music groups.</p>
<p>Curriculum Music: Our vision is:</p>	<p>The Charanga music scheme we follow throughout the school covers all areas of the national curriculum including the early years. Our vision for our curriculum music is to ensure every class has access to high quality lessons that include instruments. Children will have access to a music professional during their time at St Aidan's to learn an instrument through the Music Hub. Children will learn to play untuned instruments in KS1, tuned instruments in LKS2 and Ukuleles in UPKS2. Singing is a big part of weekly music lessons and our aim is to ensure instruments also hold a big part too.</p>
<p>Co-Curricular: Our vision is:</p>	<p>Music within St Aidan's forms a part of our wider curriculum too, with links to RE, literacy, maths and other foundation subjects. Music also forms a part of our PE curriculum, with dance units within each year group- giving more opportunities to listen, praise and perform to music. Guitar lessons are currently being established within school to begin in September 2024, provided by our school governor Vince Rice. Our music room is available for these guitar lessons on a Friday afternoon. A choir was established in the academic year 2023-2024 with performances taking place as part of our trust and visits to local care homes. The aim is to be able to continue this in the next academic year.</p>
<p>Enrichment: Our vision is:</p>	<p>Our music curriculum is continuously enriched during whole school assemblies, where we sing on entry and exit as well as within the assembly too. When the guitar club is set up and established, they will begin performing in school and when confidence and skill is built, further opportunities for joining performances with other schools will be arranged. The school choir will continue to attend the local care home, and join in with performances within our schools trust.</p>
