Literacy

Charlotte's Web: Children will learn about stories that raise issues and dilemmas. They will study the text 'Charlotte's Web' in detail and continue developing their understanding of literary techniques such as fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and use of powerful vocabulary. They will then write their own story which raises an issue.

<u>Poetry (Exploring Form)</u>. Children will study the different forms poetry can be presented in such as limericks and haikus.

Year 4 – Summer 1



Science

Animals including humans: Children will be introduced to the main body parts associated with the digestive system, for example the mouth, tongue, teeth, oesophagus, stomach, small and large intestines. They will explore questions that help them understand their special functions. They will also interpret and construct food chains

PE

<u>**Tennis:**</u> Children will develop racket control and will continue to work on their backhand and forehand shot.

Geography

Rivers and mountains: Children will learn about mountainous regions within the UK and their features. The will also learn about how rivers begin and the journey a river takes.

French food: Children will learn to ask and respond to questions found in a café conversation and will learn how to use a bilingual dictionary to translate given words. They will also complete mathematical calculations in French, writing answers in euros.
