Literacy

Continue to read our individual Reading Books/key words and Harder to Read and Spell Words, Phase 3 Phonics ELS Scheme <u>and practise daily reading at</u> <u>home.</u>

Continue to read and write some simple and more complex sentences within our daily 'Draw and Talk' lessons. We will be learning about different types of texts such as instructions, posters and non fiction and we will be writing our own stories.

Continue to write independently, listening for sounds in words we can hear and writing them down in sequence.

<u>Communication and Language – We will;</u> Listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and respond to what we hear with relevant comments, guestions or actions.

Understanding The World

Begin our topic on '**Mini beasts**'. We will look at their habitats and life cycles.

Look at and discuss similarities and differences and sort and record our findings, by observing ,drawing/painting pictures

We will observe and investigate the 'Life Cycle of a Butterfly'

We will look at what life is like in other contrasting countries around the world-looking at culture, food and lifestyle and finding these places on the world map.

At Home

- Encourage Mini beast Hunts outside. Draw and write about what you find. Make models from junk materials of your favourite Mini beast.



Mathematics

- Composition of 10 partitioning and recombining numbers
- Recall and apply double facts to 10
- Recall subtraction facts within 5
- Recall odd and even facts
- Continue working on 3D shape and making 3D shapes
- In pattern work recognise a deliberate mistake and discuss how to fix it
- Continue working on days of the week and using past, present and future vocabulary correctly.

<u>RE</u> <u>We will follow the 'Come and See'</u> <u>scheme of work.</u>

Our topic this half term is 'Good News', learning about <u>Pentecost</u>.

During this topic we will talk about sharing good news and that everyone's news is important. We will learn about the Holy Spirit and the Good News of Jesus.

- Continue to sing songs and practise using theinstruments to keep a steady beat and rhythm.
